Bob Munson (23 points, 21 rebounds), **Chris Conrad** (22 points) and **Darrell Maxwell** (20 points) combined for 65 of Bradford's 82 points ... Bradford led 21-8 late in 1st quarter before Commodores cut deficit to 6 points at half and after 3 quarters ... Bradford 14-4 run last 4:30 after Vergennes cut deficit to 68-63 ... **Howard Smith** 19 points for Vergennes.

1966 - West Rutland 64, Randolph 51

Ray Czachor had 22 points and 12 rebounds, while **Lou Glodzik** added 14 points as West Rutland won 1st title since 1952 ... The Golden Horde used a 21-12 edge in 2nd quarter for 35-20 halftime lead and built advantage to 29 points in 4th quarter before Randolph cut into the deficit ... **Tom Siret** had a game-high 28 points and 14 rebounds for Randolph.

1965 - Woodstock 84, Bradford 66

Undefeated Wasps ran out to a 27-9 lead after 1st quarter to win 2nd straight title ... Both teams scored 57 final 3 quarters, but Bradford got no closer than 49-37 in 3rd quarter and Woodstock led by as many as 25 in 4th ... Brian Doubleday 21 points to lead Woodstock, while Stan Watson 19 and Jim Fish 18 ... Marshall Blake had 23 points to lead Bradford.

1964 - Woodstock 72, Peoples 62

Peoples led 26-21 at halftime, but **Stan Watson** (25 points) and **Brian Doubleday** (19 points) combined to score 38 of Woodstock's 51 points in the 2nd half to rally for the title ... Peoples still led 49-45 after 3 quarters, but the Wasps opened the 4th period with an 8-0 run and outscored Peoples 27-13 ... **Tad Larnell** had 20 points and **Al Boright** 17 for Peoples.

1963 - Winooski 46, Woodstock 44

After Woodstock scored first 9 points of game and used a 10-3 run to end the 3rd quarter with 38-33 lead, Winooski rallied in 4th period with 12-4 run for 45-42 lead with 2:29 left for 4th straight title ... **Dave LaPointe** had 15 points and **Don Picard** had 13 to lead Winooski, while **Dennis Wright** had 16 points and **Bruce Douglas** added 14 for Woodstock.

1962 - Winooski 54, Black River 48

The Spartans won their 3rd straight title as Winooski rallied from 1st quarter deficit to lead 26-22 at half and then scored first 7 points of the 3rd quarter for an 11-point lead ... Black River cut lead to 5 at 39-34 and 49-44 in the 4th period ... **Tommy Clark** had 16 points and **Dave LaPointe** 14 to lead Winooski, while **Bruce Stryhas** 21 points for Black River.

1961 - Winooski 45, Black River 42

Dave Atkins had 31 of Spartans 45 points to lead Winooski to 2nd straight state title ... Spartans used 12-6 edge in 2nd quarter for 22-15 lead at half and led 36-30 after 3 quarters ... Black River cut deficit to 2 points in the 4th, but Winooski used 7-2 run for 45-38 lead with 27 seconds left ... **Sanford Searl** had 19 points and **Medrick Myatt** 12 for Black River.

<u> 1960 - Winooski 68, Woodstock 65</u>

Dave Atkins had a game-high 27 points, while **Skip Tipson** and **Bill Peters** each added 13 points for Winooski, which used a 19-10 edge in the 3rd quarter for a 49-38 lead ... The Spartans still led 56-46 with 4:45 left in the game before Woodstock cut the deficit to 66-61 in the final minute of play ... **Dale Spooner** had team-high 19 points for Woodstock.

1959 - Bradford 44, Black River 38

George Huntington had a game-high 26 points, including 12-of-13 from foul line, as Bradford rallied from 4th quarter deficit for 1st state title ... 1958 - Burr & Burton 64, Northfield 56

Stan Wilbur (19), **Bob Johnson** (18) and **Chris Bryant** (17) combined to score 54 of Bulldogs 64 points as Burr & Burton used 17-8 edge in 2nd quarter for 36-21 halftime lead ... Northfield cut the deficit to 6 points twice in the 4th period ... **Gary Elmer** had 19 points to lead Northfield, while **Brad Denny** and **Bob Lavalley** chipped in 12 points apiece.

1957 - Fair Haven 53, Peoples 43

Vic Ferris scored 20 of his game-high 23 points over the 1st 3 quarters as the Slaters used a 23-10 run in the 1st half to take a 27-23 lead at halftime. Peoples cut deficit to 33-32 in 3rd before Fair Haven 13-2 run gave Slaters a 46-34 lead early in 4th ... Billy Egan had 12 points and Mike Lanke 11 for Fair Haven, while Elwin Hooper 20 points for Peoples.

1956 - Black River 78, Essex 49

The Presidents dominated the 1st half with a 21-6 1st quarter and 20-6 advantage in the 2nd for a 41-12 halftime lead ... Both teams scored 37 points during the 2nd half ... **Dick Josselyn** had a game-high 30 points, while **Tommy Perrino** added 24 points for Black River ... **Bill Currier** and **Bob Hathaway** both scored a team-high 12 points for Essex.

1955 - Peoples 78, Black River 42

Peoples cruised to a 24-9 lead after the 1st quarter and a 16-8 advantage in 2nd for 40-17 lead at halftime ... Black River scored 9 straight to open 2nd half to cut deficit to 40-26, but Peoples led 53-28 after 3 quarters ... Morris Towne had 25 points to lead Peoples, while Dale Lamphear 18 points and Paul Griswold 12 ... Dick Josselyn 8 points for Black River.

1954 - Chester 51, St. Michael's (Mont) **48 Mike Nason** scored game-high 35 points, including 7 points in the final 3 minutes of the game as Chester snapped a 41-41 tie with a 6-0 run and held on for the 3-point title win ... Nason finished the night with 11 field goals and 13 free throws, including a pair with 1:22 left for a 49-45 lead ... Joe Skirry had 20 points (14 in 1st half) to lead St. Michael's.

1953 - St. Michael's (Mont) 50, Chester 33

Joe Skirry had agame-high 19 points, while **AI Theriault** added 16 points to lead St. Michael's to the state title ... The Crusaders jumped out to a 16-11 lead after 1 quarter and 24-17 at halftime before building their advantage to as many as 13 points in the 3rd quarter before settling for a 33-23 lead after 3 periods ... **Mike Nason** had 15 points to lead Chester.

1952 - West Rutland 47, Northfield 41

West Rutland won its 3rd straight title and 7th in 8 years as they held off Northfield in 2nd half ... Golden Horde used a 16-10 2nd quarter for a 27-19 lead before Northfield cut deficit to 41-37 late in 4th ... Lucien Bartlett had a gamehigh 18 points for West Rutland, while Hank Poplaski added 12 ... Jack Boroffio led Northfield with 15 points.

1951 - West Rutland 48, Waterbury 34

Hank Poplaski scored 8 of his game-high 18 points in the 2nd quarter as West Rutland outscored the Longhorns 16-6 to take a 28-20 lead at halftime ... Waterbury was able to cut the deifcit to 39-26 after 3 periods and 40-32 early in the 4th ... Tom LaPlaca added 13 points in win for Golden Horde, while Buddy Eastman scored 13 points to lead Waterbury.

1950 - West Rutland 45, Northfield 42

The Golden Horde rallied from 23-20 halftime as **Joe Pluta** had 14 points and **Frank Kapusta** 12 points to lead West Rutland to state title ... West Rutland outscored Northfield 11-6 in the 3rd period for a 31-29 lead and took a 44-41 lead on a **Tom LaPlaca** field goal with 2:25 left in the game ... **Del Gokey** scored a game-high 18 points for Northfield.

1949 - Winooski 40, St. Michael's (Brat) 34

Winooski rallied from a 5-point halftime deficit and scored half their points from foul line with 20 made free throws ... Winooski used an 8-1 run for a 28-25 lead after 3 quarters and led by just 2 when they scored 4 straight for a 36-30 lead with 2:58 left ... **Dick Sweeney** had 11 points for Winooski and **Dick Fleming** a game-high 21 points for St. Michael's.

1948 - West Rutland 35, St. Michael's (Mont) 32

Johnny Bloomer had a game-high 19 points as West Rutland won 4th straight state title ... West Rutland used 10-4 advantage in 2nd quarter for 18-11 lead at halftime and led by just 3 points before 6-2 run for a 35-28 lead with 2:00 left ... St. Michael's cut deficit to 35-32 with 1 minute left, but got no closer ... **Howie Paxman** 18 points for St. Michael's.

1947 - West Rutland 28, Winooski 24

West Rutland used a 6-1 run to start 4th period to build a 26-19 lead, then held off late Winooski rally for 3rd straight title ... The Millers cut deficit to 26-24 with chance to tie game, but missed a shot and West Rutland got the final points on a layup with 40 seconds left ... **Johnny Bloomer** had 8 points for West Rutland and **Tom Sullivan** 12 points for Winooski.

1946 - West Rutland 36, St. Michael's (Mont) 32

Holding just a 33-32 West Rutland's **Nick LaPlaca** sealed a win with a 3-point play with 30 seconds left ... West Rutland used a 10-3 run for a 20-15 lead at halftime and led 31-25 after 3 quarters before St. Michael's rallied with a 7-2 run in 4th ... **Teddy Pawlaczyk** had 12 points to lead West Rutland, whiole **Howie Paxman** a game-high 13 for St. Michael's.

1945 - West Rutland 50, St. Michael's (Mont) 40

After trailing 20-18 at halftime, West Rutland used a quick 14-4 run to take an 8-point lead and outscored St. Michael's 20-6 in the 3rd quarter for 38-26 lead entering final period... West Rutland built the lead to as many as 16 points in 4th ... **Leonard Tyl** had a game-high 16 points to lead West Rutland, while **Ed Normandeau** 14 points for St. Michael's.

1944 - Proctor 30, St. Michael's (Mont) 29

Allen Pratt scored a game-high 13 points, including a free throw in the final seconds that snapped a 29-29 tie ... Proctor led 16-15 at halftime and outscored St. Michael's 11-10 in the 3rd before scoring 1st basket of 4th for a 29-25 lead ... St. Michael's then scored next 4 points to tie game at 29 ... Sonny Shea had 11 points (8 in 3rd) to lead St. Michael's.

1941 - Randolph 26, St. Michael's (Mont) 19

After scoring just 12 points and trailing by 3 points after 3 quarters, Randolph scored 14 points in 4th quarter including the final 6 points of the game ... St. Michael's led 12-8 at half and 18-16 in 4th when Randolph scored 10 of final 11 points ... Austin Wood had 13 points and Howard Rainey 10 for Randolph ... Maurice Marineau 9 points for St. Michael's.

1940 - Randolph 14, St. Michael's (Mont) 13

In lowest scoring Division 2 championship game all-time, Randolph scored winning bucket with just over a minute left and were able to freeze the ball for most of final 60 seconds ... Randolph led 2-1 after 1 period and 8-7 at half before St. Michael's tied game 11-11 after 3 ... **Paul Neil** 6 points for Randolph and **Maurice Martineau** 7 for St. Michael's.

<u>1939 - Poultney 18, St. Michael's (Mont) 17</u>

Ed Hannon scored a game-high 8 points, including the final 4 points of game to lead Poultney to state title ... Poultney led 5-3 after the 1st quarter and 10-9 at halftime, but St. Michael's rallied to take a 13-12 after 3 periods before building the lead to 17-14 with a couple of minutes remaining ... **Maurice Martineau** had 7 points for St. Michael's.

1938 - Black River 26, Waterbury 19

Lampert scored a game-high 14 points, including 6 during a 12-0 Black River run at the end of the 2nd quarter for an 18-8 Presidents lead at halftime ... Waterbury cut the deficit to 19-16 after 3 quarters and then scored the 1st point of the 4th period before Waterbury ran off the next 4 points for a 23-17 advantage ... **Parks** scored 7 points to lead Waterbury.

1937 - Waterbury 37, Orleans 34 (ot)

After trailing almost entire game, Waterbury forced overtime at 31-31 on a **James Sabin** field goal in final seconds and then scored the first 6 points of the extra period for 37-31 lead ... **Waitstill Brown** had 12 points and **John Eagan** added 11 points, including 4 in overtime, to lead Waterbury ... **Cummings** scored a game-high 14 points to lead Orleans.

1936 - Rochester 35, Craftsbury 30

Kearnan Aldrich scored a team-high 12 points, while Oris Sanders and Stanley Stearns both added 11 points to lead Rochester to the state title ... The contest was tied 16-16 at half before Craftsbury built a 25-20 lead in 3rd period, but Rochester used 5-0 run to tie game at end of 3rd and had 10-5 edge in 4h ... Charlie Smith led Craftsbury with 14 points.

1935 - Orleans 32, Black River 16

Mike Malshuk had game-high 14 points and **Mason** added 12 points to lead Orleans to its 3rd straight state title victory ... Orleans built a 10-7 lead after the 1st quarter before outscoring Black River 6-1 in the 2nd for an 8-point halftime lead ... Orleans then extended its lead to 24-12 after 3 quarters ... **Lampert** finished with 7 points to lead Black River.

1934 - Orleans 26, Whitcomb 16

Orleans won its 2nd straight state title as **Mike Malshuk** had a game-high 12 points, including all 8 of Orleans 3rd period points to build a 20-10 lead ... Tied 6-6 after 1 period, Orleans scored all 6 points in 2nd for a 12-6 halftime lead before outscoring Whitcomb 8-4 in 3rd for the 10-point lead ... 4 different Whitcomb players each scored 4 points in loss.

1933 - Orleans 32, Whitcomb 23

After leading by just 3 points after 1st quarter, Orleans used 12-5 advantage in the 2nd period for a 20-10 lead at halftime and a 10-9 edge in the 3rd quarter for an 11-point advantage heading to the 4th ... Orleans outscored Whitcomb just 4-2 in 4th quarter ... Marshall had game-high 12 points for Orleans and Dante Borella had 10 points for Whitcomb.

1932 - Bradford 27, Craftsbury 21

After Craftsbury cut 10-point halftime deficit to just 1 point, Bradford scored the first 6 points of the 4th quarter for its 1st state title ... Bradford built a 17-7 halftime lead and led just 19-18 after 3 before 6-0 run to start 4th ... **Bob Kelley** had 12 points and **Dan Murphy** 11 for Bradford, while **Ernest Young** and **Alex Harper** 7 points each for Craftsbury.

1931 - Hardwick 18, Craftsbury 17 (ot)

In title game with just 35 total points but 7 ties, Hardwick's **Shuttuck** tied game 17-17 on a free throw with 8 seconds left in regulation and hit another free throw for only point of overtime ... Craftsbury led 7-5 at half, but Hardwick tied game 12-12 after 3 periods ... **Bruno Gagetta** had 8 points for Hardwick, while **Ernest Young** 10 points for Craftsbury.

1930 - Barton 18, St. Michael's (Mont) 13

Barton held St. Michael's to just 5 points in the 2nd half, including scoreless in the 4th quarter to win the state title ... Barton led 3-2 after the 1st period and 10-8 at halftime ... Each team had 5 points in 3rd for a 15-13 lead for Barton, which had only 3 points of 4th ... Harry Lewis 8 points for Barton, while Halligan and Alexander 5 for St. Michael's.

1929 - Orleans 27, Hardwick 18

Daniel Smith had game-high 14 points, including 6 points in the final 2 minutes of game to clinch the 1st-ever Division 2 title for Orleans ... Trailing 6-2 after the 1st quarter and 13-4 at halftime, Hardwick cut the deficit to 16-10 after the 3rd quarter and stayed close in the 4th until Smith's late 6-point outbreak ... **George Sim** scored 8 points to lead Hardwick.
