2024 - Grace Christian 52, Danville 41

After 13 lead changes over the first 3 quarters, the Lions used a 17-10 edge in 3rd quarter to erase a 4-point halftime deficit and pulled away in 4th for their 1st state title ... **Vojin Cosic** paced Grace Christian with 15 points, while **Baran Turan** added 12 points and **Danilo Ignjatovic** 10 ... **Cooper Calkins** had 15 points and **Andrew Joncas** 10 for Danville

2023 - Rivendell 49, Mid-VT Christian 41

Harry Molesworth 15 points, 18 rebounds, 5 assists and 5 steals to lead Raptors to their 1st-ever state title ... MVCS had early 7-point lead before Rivendell led by 7 at half and by as many as 13 in 4th before MVCS cut deficit to 45-41 with 25 seconds left ... **Ashton Pierson** added 11 points and **Finn O'Donnell** 10 for Raptors, **Joel Roberts** 17 points for MVCS

2022 - Blue Mountain 26, White River Valley 25

Jacob Duke hit 3-pointer at the buzzer to give the Bucks the title in lowest scoring D4 final all-time ... **Evan Dennis** had 7 points to lead Blue Mountain, while **John Dennis** 6 points (including 3-pt to tie game 23-23 in final 40 seconds ... **Dominic Craven** had 9 points, **Weston Trombly** 8 points and **Brayden Russ** (FG for 25-23 lead) 6 points for WRV

2021 - Proctor 58, West Rutland 57

Tied at halftime, Phantoms 20-11 edge in 3rd period for 43-34 lead and led 49-41 mid 4th before hitting late free throws ... **Brennon Crossmon** led Proctor with 24 points and hit 7-of-9 FTs in 4th (2 FT w/:08.4 left for a 58-55 lead), while **Connor McKearin** 17 points, 7 rebounds, 6 steals ... **Tyler Serrani** 20 points and **Tim Blanchard** 15 for West Rutland

2020 - Proctor 65, Twin Valley 50

After Twin Valley cut 8-point deficit to 22-21 at half, Proctor used a 17-9 edge in 3rd quarter for a 9-point lead before 44-32 advantage with 6:00 left and 57-44 with 1:30 left ... **Logan Starlins** led Proctor with 18 points, while **Solomon Parker** 13 and **Brennon Crossmon** 11 ... **Owen Grinold** had 14 points and **Jack McHale** 11 points for Twin Valley

2019 - Danville 57, Poultney 44

Down 2 points late in 3rd quarter Danville went on 15-3 run to take 49-39 lead with 4:13 left in game, then scored final 8 points of game after Poultney cut deficit to 49-44 with 2:35 left ... **Ian Steele** scored 13 of his game-high 24 points in 1st quarter and grabbed 10 rebounds for Danville ... **Keith Mason** had 19 points and **Levi Haviland** 15 for Poultney.

2018 - Sharon 60, Danville 56

Sharon won its 1st-ever state title in any sport, scoring final 5 points of game in final minute ... Sharon led 47-37 after 3 periods before Danville rallied to take 56-55 lead with 1:08 left ... **Sam Knoerlein** had game-high 26 points for Sharon, while **Fisher Kelley** added 16 and **Avery Gaudette** 13 ... **Ian Steele** led Danville with 23 points, including 7 3-pointers.

2017 - Proctor 53, Twinfield 41

Nick Ojala had 18 points and **Gannon McKearin** 15 points to lead Proctor to its 3rd straight state title ... Tied at half-time, the Phatoms used an 11-6 edge in 3rd to take a 34-29 lead before 4 straight points to start 4th and a 3-pointer built advantage to 45-36 with 3 minutes left ... **Kris Utton** had 9 points and **Jordan Moore** 8 points to lead Twin Valley.

2016 - Proctor 32, Twinfield 30

Twinfield rallied from a 28-17 deficit with a 12-0 run to take the lead with under a minute left, but a **Nick Ojala** leaner gave Proctor the lead back 30-29 and **Nick Swaine** hit a pair of free throws in closing seconds to seal title for Phantoms ... **Gannon McKearin** led Proctor with 8 points, while **Jordan Moore** 11 points and 9 rebounds to lead Twinfield.

2015 - Proctor 70, Sharon 66 (ot)

Proctor rallied from a 55-51 deficit to force overtime tied at 56-56, then rallied from a 66-61 deficit by scoring game's last 9 points over final 35 seconds of OT ... **Nick Swane** had game-high 27 points for Proctor, including 22 in 2nd half and OT, while **Curtis Tominson** added 19 points ... **Andy Bando-Hess** 20 points and **Brandon Tracy** 16 for Sharon.

2014 - Danville 50, Twin Valley 43

Trailing 43-33 with just 5 minutes left, Danville scored the final 17 points of the game for its 1st state title since 1989 ... **Kyle Johnson** (12 rebounds) and **Patrick White** (5 rebounds) both had a game-high 20 points as they combined for 40 of the Indians 50 points ... **Dal Nesbitt** had 13 points to lead Twin Valley, while **Colin Lozito** added 12 points.

2013 - Rochester 68, West Rutland 43

Pavin Parrish scored 38 points to lead the Rockets, going 14-of-22 from the field (4-of-4 from 3-point range) with 3 rebounds, 5 assists and 4 steals ... West Rutland led 14-11 early in the 2nd quarter when Rochester went on a 27-4 run, 14 points for Parrish, to take a 38-18 lead ... **Jordan Pease** had 13 points and 7 rebounds to lead the Golden Horde.

2012 - Twinfield 61, Danville 52

David Codling had a team-high 17 points and grabbed 10 rebounds for Twinfield, while **Chad Copeland** added 12 points and pulled down a game-high 15 rebounds ... Codling scored first 8 points of 3rd quarter for Twinfield, which won its 2nd straight state title game ... Danville was led by **Tony Burrington** with 20 points, while **Kyle Johnson** added 14.

2011 - Twinfield 64, Danville 58

Chad Copeland went 13-for-21 from the floor to score 32 points and grabbed 16 rebounds, while **David Codling** 16 points for undefeated Twinfield ... Trojans led 52-46 with 4:11 left and hit 10-of-12 free throws in the final 1:24 ... **Tony Burrington** led Danville with 19 points (7-of-11 from field, 5-of-5 at line), while **Solomon Little** added 12 points.

2010 - Williamstown 47, Proctor 41

Williamstown won its 1st title since 1986 while snapping Proctor's 4-year reign as champ ... Phantoms led 24-16 when Blue Devils used a 9-0 run for a 25-24 halftime lead ... Game stayed within 6 points throughout 2nd half ... **Ray Burgos** 17 points and **Troy Laughlin** 10 for Williamstown, while **Nate Salgo** 17 points and **Zach Currier** 10 for Proctor.

2009 - Proctor 47, Websterville 38

Curtis Robinson scored a game-high 23 points, including 16 of Proctor's 24 points in 2nd half as undefeated Phantoms won 4th straight state title ... Proctor led by as many as 14 before 23-16 lead at half, while Websterville cut deficit to 5 points early in 3rd ... **Ryan Carter** 9 points and 10 rebounds for Proctor, while **Issac Ransom** 15 points for Websterville.

The Phantoms won its 3rd straight state title after outscoring Danville 8-2 down stretch after Indians had used a 7-0 run to tie game 42-42 ... **Kyle McQuarrie** game-high 16 points for Proctor, which had led by 10 points in 2nd quarter ... **Jordan Snow** added 12 points for Phantoms, while **Logan Calkins** had 15 points and **Matt Chamberlin** 9 points for Danville.

2007 - Proctor 46, West Rutland 44

Kyle McQuarrie's 3-pointer gave Proctor its 1st lead of game at 45-44 with 2 minutes left as Phantoms completed an undefeated season ... **McQuarrie** had 12 points, while **Curtis Robinson** 11 points and 13 rebounds for Proctor ... **Greg Hughes** scored 14 of his game-high 20 points in 1st quarter for West Rutland, while **Jordan Newth** scored 10 points.

2006 - Proctor 58, West Rutland 50

Randy Chartrand had 21 points and grabbed 19 rebounds, while **Kyle McQuarrie** 16 points as Proctor used a 12-2 run at start of 2nd half to take a 42-22 ... Phantoms still led by 20 with 4:46 left in 4th before West Rutland cut deficit to 8 ... **Greg Hughes** had 13 points, 5 rebounds and 6 steals for West Rutland, while **Jamie Rajda** 10 points and 5 rebounds.

2005 - Cabot 56, West Rutland 54

Bobby Martino's layup with 50 seconds left snapped 54-54 tie and led Cabot to state title ... Huskies had led by 16 points before 17-0 run gave West Rutland a 45-44 lead midway thru 4th ... A 10-4 run gave Cabot 54-49 lead with 1:52 left ... **Ian Ackermann** had 21 points for Cabot, while **Jamie Rajda** 16 points and **Ryan Cameron** 13 for West Rutland.

2004 - Proctor 30, West Rutland 29

Josh Dobart's go ahead layup with 22 seconds left was only points in final 4 minutes after West Rutland had taken a 29-28 lead with 4:13 left ... Proctor trailed 21-12 at half, but cut deficit to 25-24 with a 12-4 edge in 3rd quarter ... **Michael Harper** led Proctor with 11 points ... **Don Dunchus** scored all of his game-high 13 points in 1st half for West Rutland.

2003 - Cabot 63, Chelsea 39

Cabot won 1st state title in school history after jumping out to a 16-2 lead in 1st quarter and a 29-17 edge at half ... **Ian Ackermann** had 19 points and 8 rebounds for Cabot, while **Jimmy Ackermann** added 15 points and 8 rebounds ... **Cabot Savidge** led Chelsea with 15 points and 6 rebounds, while **Nick Battey** had 14 points and grabbed 7 rebounds.

2002 - Richford 52, Cabot 51

Richford built a 12-point lead early in 3rd quarter, but had to rally from a late 5-point deficit with 10-1 run for 52-48 lead with 1:31 left ... **Pat Stephens** 24 points and 10 rebounds for Richford, while **Brian Hatch** had 13 points and 18 rebounds ... **Jimmy Ackermann** led Cabot with 17 points and 9 rebounds, while **Jason Porter** had 4 points and 11 rebounds.

2001 - Blue Mountain 58, Whitcomb 47

Jon Murray scored a game-high 28 points, including first 8 points of game and 6 straight during a 9-0 run to give Blue Mountain 54-45 lead with 1:08 left ... Bucks led 34-24 at half, but Whitcomb tied game 45-45 with 3:25 left ... **Ryan Speer** and **Justin Bryer** 11 points each for Bucks, while **Brett Forrest** 15 points and **Nate Ward** 14 for Whitcomb.

2000 - Proctor 72, Blue Mountain 62

Scott Allenby had game-high 25 points and **Brin Finnigan** added 20 points as Proctor won its 1st state title since 1972 ... Blue Mountain led 24-23 after the 1st quarter, but Proctor took 40-38 lead at halftime and then outscored Bucks 17-9 in the 3rd for a 57-47 advantage ... **Jon Murray** had 24 points and **Justin Bryer** added 16 points for Blue Mountain.

1999 - United Christian 69, Blue Mountain 67

Aaron Lussier (13 points) hit a 3-pointer with 28 seconds left to give UCA a 68-67 advantage, just its 2nd lead of game (other 2-0) ... Blue Mountain led by 10 before UCA had 24-12 edge over final 6:30 of game ... **Joe Witherspoon** had 20 points and **Ingo Hofmann** 18 for UCA, while **Mike Murray** 20 points and **Jon Murray** 14 for Blue Mountain.

1998 - Blue Mountain 76, Rochester 62

Scott Murray and **Mike Murray** both scored 17 points to lead Bucks to state title ... Blue Mountain was 8-of-12 from 3-point range in 1st half for 42-24 lead at break ... Bucks led by 23 early in 3rd before Rockets cut deficit to 58-50 early in 4th ... **Scott Blood** 15 points and 12 rebounds for Bucks, while **Dean Pierce** 27 points and 15 rebounds for Rochester.

1997 - Twinfield 62, Rochester 55

Jason Getz had a game-high 21 points and 13 rebounds, while **Greg Gove** also added 19 points as Twinfield hit 10-of-13 free throws in final 2 minutes to secure 2nd straight state title ... **Will Chadwick** had 20 points and **Dean Pierce** 16 for Rochester, which led 30-28 at half and 39-32 early in 3rd quarter before Trojans used 18-5 run for 6-point lead.

1996 - Twinfield 56, Websterville 44

After trailing by as many as 8 points in 1st half and 23-22 at the break, Twinfield took a 40-34 lead after 3 quarters before scoring first 7 points of the 4th to open up a 13-point lead and cap an undefeated season ... **Randy Rathburn** and **Ira Wheeler** each scored 13 points to lead Twinfield, while **Eric Enright** had 14 points and 11 rebounds for Websterville.

1995 - West Rutland 51, Rochester 48

Trailing 48-45 in the last two minutes, West Rutland scored the final 6 points of the game to win its 1st state title since 1978 ... **Josh Pietryka** had 15 points, **Pat Loughan** 14 and **Matt Beaulieu** 11 for West Rutland, which hit 10 3-pointers in the game ... **Ethan Moulton** had game-high 23 points for Rochester, which had 3 shots to tie game in final 34 seconds.

1994 - Poultney 56, Twinfield 41

Scott Saltis scored a game-high 15 points, while **Jason Phillips** and **Jason Thomas** both added 10 points as the Devils used a late 8-2 run to open up a 48-38 lead with 2:02 left ... Poultney had 28-21 lead at halftime and 38-30 after 3 periods before Trojans cut deficit to 40-36 in 4th quarter ... **Mark Khouri** had 14 points and 16 rebounds for Twinfield.

1993 - Rochester 61, Craftsbury 60

After Craftsbury had rallied from a 13-point deficit with an 11-0 run, **Jim Bowen** hit 2 free throws with 19 seconds left to give Rochester a 61-57 lead (Craftsbury hit 3-pointer in the final seconds) ... **Eric Moulton** and **Craig Lafan** had 17 points apiece for Rochester, while **Jeff Davis** scored a game-high 31 points and **Pat Reil** added 19 points for Craftsbury

Chargers led 24-16 in 2nd quarter, but Poultney 23-11 run for 4-point lead ... **Wally Ainsworth** had 19 points and **Dana Michel** 16 for Poultney, while **Pat Reil** led Craftsbury with 19 points.

1991 - Poultney 76, Craftsbury 56

Dana Michel had a game-high 18 points as Poultney used a 25-6 run during the 3rd quarter to break open a 35-27 Blue Devils halftime advantage ... **Sandi Sumner** added 12 points for Poultney, while **Kevin Warren** and **Jason Adams** each scored 10 points ... **John Duffell** led Craftsbury with 16 points, while **Duncan Simmons** 12 and **Pete Richards** 11.

1990 - Craftsbury 60, Richford 59

Nikos Levin snapped 59-59 tie on free throw with 1:35 left and held on after Richford free throw lane violation with 3 seconds left ... **Duncan Simmons** had game-high 21 points for Craftsbury, including 12 of Chargers 18 in 3rd quarter, while **John Duffell** had 16 points and 17 rebounds ... **Matt Parsons** 19 points and **Mike McAllister** 17 for Richford.

1989 - Danville 80, Whitcomb 65

Dab Hudson scored 14 of his game-high 25 points in the 1st quarter, while Danville went 26-of-38 from the foul line to outscore Whitcomb 26-10 ... Indians led 37-31 at half and 49-45 before outscoring Hornets 31-20 over final 10 minutes ... **Jon Edwards** added 18 points for Danville, while **Jason Mousley** led Whitcomb with 24 points and 14 rebounds.

1988 - Richford 66, Danville 65

Paul Garrow scored 38 points and grabbed 22 rebounds to lead Richford to its 1st-ever state title ... The Rockets led 35-30 at half and 52-49 after 3 periods, but Danville took a 53-52 lead early in 4th ... Richford responded with a 10-2 run and led 66-61 with 21 seconds left ... **Jeff Zangla** had 16 points to lead Danville and **Gary Yoder** chipped in with 15.

1987 - Black River 79, Blue Mountain 73

Matt Warnecke scored 30 points and grabbed 21 rebounds as he and **Greg Witalec** (22 points) combined for 15 of the Presidents 17 points in the 4th quarter ... Black River led 36-32 at half and 62-54 after 3 periods before the Bucks cut the deficit to 67-64 with 4:43 left ... **Gary Thompson** had 19 points and **Chris Gandin** 18 points for Blue Mountain.

1986 - Blue Mountain 67, Chelsea 48

Charlie Hazen scored 21 points and **Gary Thompson** 18 points to lead Blue Mountain to its 2nd straight state title ... The Bucks led 15-6 after 1 quarter, 31-18 at halftime and used a 21-point 3rd period for a 52-32 advantage ... Closest that Chelsea was able to cut deficit was 56-43 with 4:51 left ... **Rory Allan** scored a team-high 19 points for Chelsea.

1985 - Blue Mountain 63, Black River 44

The Bucks used a 13-5 run to end the 2nd quarter with a 31-21 lead, then an 18-4 run during the 3rd quarter for a 49-29 advantage to clinch the title ... **Gary Thompson** had a game-high 17 points for Blue Mountain, while **Chris Davidson** added 14 points and 13 rebounds ... **Matt Graves** scored 16 points and **Shane Blanchard** 12 points for Black River.

1984 - Twinfield 70, Chelsea 48

Twinfield won its 2nd straight title building a 17-6 lead after 1st quarter, 34-21 at halftime and 48-28 after 3 periods ... Trojans largest lead of game was 60-30 with 4:40 left in 4th ... **Mike Orton** scored 13 of team-high 19 points in 1st half and **Greg Barcomb** added 15 points for Twinfield ... **Dennis McLaughlin** finished with game-high 27 points for Chelsea.

1983 - Twinfield 76, Sacred Heart 71

After trailing 51-44 after 3 quarters, Twinfield outscored the Cardinals 32-20 in the 4th period for the 5-point win ... **Mike Orton** had a game-high 27 points for Twinfield and **Matt Dix** added 23 points, including 6 straight that gave Trojans lead for good at 56-55 lead with 5:09 left ... **Geoff Starr** had 26 points and **Mark Geraghty** 21 points for Sacred Heart.

1982 - Danville 66, Wilmington 50

Danville trailed 29-26 at halftime, but the Indians outscored Wilmington 40-21 in 2nd half (18-6 in the 3rd period) ... **Darren White** had 19 points, 18 rebounds and 8 assists for Danville, while **Dave Couture** 19 points and 13 rebounds ... **John McConnell** added 17 points for Indians, while **Erik Nilsen** and **Tim Barton** had 12 points each for Wilmington.

1981 - Whitcomb 55, Danville 51

Trailing 43-34 with 2 minutes left in 3rd quarter, Whitcomb used a 20-0 run over next 7 minutes for 54-43 lead before Danville 8-0 run cut deficit to 54-51 with 27 seconds left ... **Tony Lambertson** 24 points and 13 rebounds for Whitcomb, while **Jeff Mills** had 19 points and 14 rebounds ... **Scott Whitcomb** 14 points and **Garren Calkins** 12 for Danville.

1980 - Whitcomb 67, Richford 59

Tony Lambertson had 18 points and **Lang Durfee** added 16 points, including 12-of-15 from foul line, to lead Whitcomb to its 1st-ever state title in 1st finals appearance in 45 years ... Whitcomb used a 7-0 run for 54-43 lead, then hit 11-of-14 free throws in final 1:35 after Richford had cut the deficit to 5 points ... **Dale Larnell** game-high 23 points for Richford.

Rockets led 31-15 with 4 minutes left in 2nd quarter, but Twinfield rallied for 52-49 lead with 4 minutes left in 4th ... **Henry Clark** added 15 points for Rochester, while **Gary Klinefelter** 20 points for Twinfield.

1969 - Twinfield 69, Rochester 61

Charlie Burbank scored 19 of his 24 points in 2nd half while hitting 8 straight shots as Twinfield rallied from a 53-49 deficit in the 4th quarter for 1st title since 1959 ... **Gary Klinefelter** added 19 points and 16 rebounds for Twinfield, while **Jim Kuehn** had 16 points and 19 rebounds ... **Chuck Simpson** had 18 points and 14 rebounds to lead Rochester.

1968 - Rochester 62, Danville 56

Tied at halftime, Rochester outscored Danville 20-6 in 3rd quarter for 51-37 lead and held off an Indians rally in 4th period that cut deficit to 58-56 in the final minute ... **Chuck Simpson** and **T. Simpson** both finished with 14 points to lead Rochester to its 1st state title since 1944, while **Dan Gandin** had 15 points and **Steve Daniels** 13 for Craftsbury.

1967 - North Troy 75, Brighton 50

Jim Wing hit 15-of-22 shots from the field to score a game-high 31 points as North Troy opened up a 21-11 lead after 1 quarter and built on the lead each of the next 3 quarters ... North Troy increased advantage to 39-28 at half and then outscored Brighton 17-10 in the 3rd for 56-38 lead ... **Earl Lefebvre** 20 points and **Ray Gaboriault** 12 for Brighton.

1966 - Danville 74, Rochester 66

Dwayne Lynaugh had 35 points, while **Dennis Lynaugh** added 13 points and 13 rebounds as Danville saw a 26-point lead cut to 5 but won its 3rd straight title ... Danville scored first 13 points of 3rd quarter for 52-26 lead, but Rochester cut the deficit to 69-64 with 2 minutes left ... **Bill Blair** had 23 points, **Earl Simpson** 19 and **Earl Mills** 18 Rochester.

1965 - Danville 83, Johnson 53

Brothers **Dwayne** (24 points), **Donald** (17) and **Dale** (13) **Lynaugh** combined to outscore Johnson 54-53 ... Danville led 11-0 before Johnson cut deficit to 34-28 with 1 minute left in 1st half ... Danville 29-14 edge next 9 minutes for 63-42 lead after 3 quarters ... **Jim Gillen** led Johnson with 12 points, while **Wayne Gillen** and **Barry Martinelli** 11 each.

1964 - Danville 66, Shoreham 50

Danville jumped out to a 13-0 start and 15-5 lead after 1st quarter as 4 Indians combined to score all 66 points ... **Frank Champman** had 19 points and **Darryl Calkins** 16 to lead Danville, while **Dwayne Lynaugh** added 16 and **Don Lynaugh** 15 ... The Indians led 34-22 at half and 46-30 after 3 quarters ... **Wayne Cook** had 18 points to lead Shoreham.

1963 - Lamoille 45, Brighton 42

After Brighton had taken a 42-41 lead with 40 seconds left, Lamoille got a field goal from **Roger Ballard** to retake the lead and a basket from **Ray Hayes** with 10 seconds left to seal title ... Lamoille led 15-11 at half and 27-21 after 3 periods ... **Bob Knowlton** had 24 points and Hayes 10 points to lead Lamoille, while **Paul Lefebvre** 11 points for Brighton.

1962 - Groton 57, Shelburne 41

Jericho built a 28-16 halftime lead and led by 10 most of the 2nd half before holding on for 2-point victory ... Jericho led 38-28 after 3 quarters and 51-43 with 31 seconds left before Swanton scored final 6 points ... **Dean Powell** had 20 points and **Barry Aldinger** 12 for Jericho ... **Ed Bracey**, **Ron Mott** and **John Palmer** each had 13 points for Swanton.

1959 - Plainfield 59, Alburg 35

Doug Hudson scored 12 of his game-high 16 points in the 1st half to lead Plainfield to the title ... **Bruce Bartlett** added 14 points for Plainfield, while **Dan Hudson** chipped in with 13 ... Plainfield ran out to 25-18 lead at halftime, used 14-6 run in 3rd for 39-24 advantage and led by as many as 59-30 in final minute ... **Francis Jarvis** 11 points to lead Alburg.

1958 - Brighton 52, Craftsbury 39

Lynn Brooks had a game-high 24 points as Brighton used a 14-6 edge in 3rd quarter for a 43-30 lead and held Craftsbury to 15 points in 2nd half ... Brighton used 7-3 run for a 29-24 lead at half, while Craftsbury went just 1-of-30 from field in 2nd half ... **Dick Perry** 10 points for Brighton, while **Dave Johnson** 20 points (10 from foul line) to lead Craftsbury.
